Applications open for film/TV scheme for unemployed Londoners

Four Corners launches the third year of its successful *Digital Futures* training programme with a screening event at Genesis Cinema on Wednesday 11 July at 6.30pm.

Digital Futures 2013 offers entirely free, specialist training for 40 unemployed Londoners, with funding from the Big Lottery and Trust for London.

This year, Four Corners is delighted to announce additional support from the FT2 Legacy Fund, continuing FT2's impressive work in supporting trainees into junior roles in high-end drama. The scheme will offer work placements for **eight** trainees **with prior experience** in camera and editing. The aim is to support training for new entrants looking to establish freelance careers in junior technical and craft positions for UK feature film or TV drama production.

Digital Futures runs from January 2013, providing specialist training in camera, production and editing, with priority given to residents of Tower Hamlets, Hackney and Newham. The associated employability programme is funded by Trust for London. The scheme is open to applicants with a range of prior skills levels.

Carla Mitchell, Development Director of Four Corners said: "Support from the Big Lottery, Trust for London and FT2 Legacy Fund means that we can provide free training for disadvantaged people at a time of increased demand, providing real opportunities for them to develop a career in film and TV. Paid work placements are particularly needed at this time of economic hardship." ENDS
